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INSTRUCTION FOR AUTHORS

The Journal publishes original research papers and short communications relevant to freshwater, brackishwater and marine environments.

Research papers should report the results of original research. The material should not have been previously published elsewhere.

Short Communication is a concise but complete description of a limited investigation, which will not be included in a later paper. Short Communications should be as completely documented, both by reference to the literature and description of the experimental procedures employed, as a regular paper. They should not be longer than 6 printed pages including figures, tables and references.

The journal will be in open access platform and resort to green publishing, without any submission through hard copies.

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Verify this checklist to carry out a final check of your submission before you send it to the journal for review.

1. Cover letter from the corresponding author, with the full address, email and phone number of all the authors, with a statement that the manuscript is based on original research and has not been submitted to other journals or sources for publication. The authors should also state that the work described has not been published previously that it is not under consideration for publication elsewhere, that its publication is approved by all authors and that, if accepted, it will not be published elsewhere, including electronically, in the same form, in English or in any other language, without the written consent of the journal.

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Upload the following documents along with submission through email (jabf@keralauniversity.ac.in)

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Introduction: State the objectives of the work and provide an adequate background, avoiding detailed literature survey or a summary of the results. Use recent references as far as possible and avoid quoting predatory journals.

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Results and Discussion: Results should be clear and concise, with tables and figures. Avoid presenting the same data in tables and figures. All graphs, line drawings and computerised

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Discussion should explore the significance of the results of the work, not repeat them. Avoid extensive citations and discussion of published literature. The main conclusions of the study may be presented as a short paragraph towards the end of this section.

Acknowledgements: Should be concise and limited to those who supported the work directly. The funding agencies should be specifically mentioned in full and the permission letters, if any, should be given as order/permission numbers.

Foot notes should be avoided in the article.

The authors should provide a point-to-point reply to the reviewers comments and the comments recorded as track edited file. The revised submission without reply to the reviewers will be rejected.

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
